Sharing Ratings and Creating Snapshots

The Ratings Page allows observers to

- View evidence alongside rubric proficiency language
- Lead objective, evidence-based conversations about performance
- Identify clear action steps for growth

Viewing Aggregated Evidence and Assigning Ratings

There are two ways to view aggregated evidence and assign ratings.

Option 1

Within an observation or meeting activity click on "Rating Activity" to view:

- A learner's evidence and assigned ratings
- A teacher's rubric and the proficiency-level language for each component of the rubric
- All the collected evidence collected within the observation aligned to each indicator.

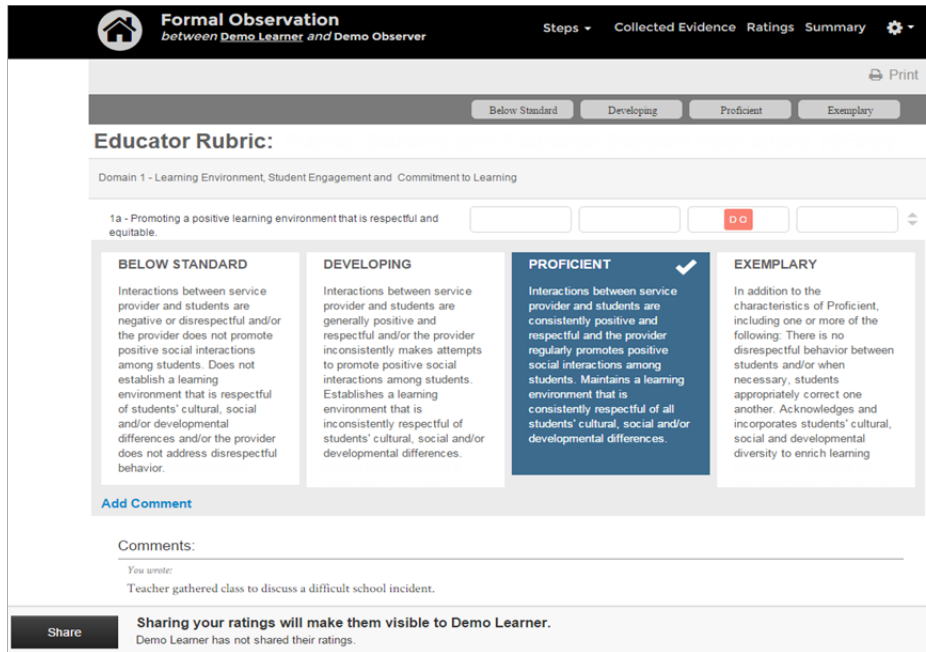

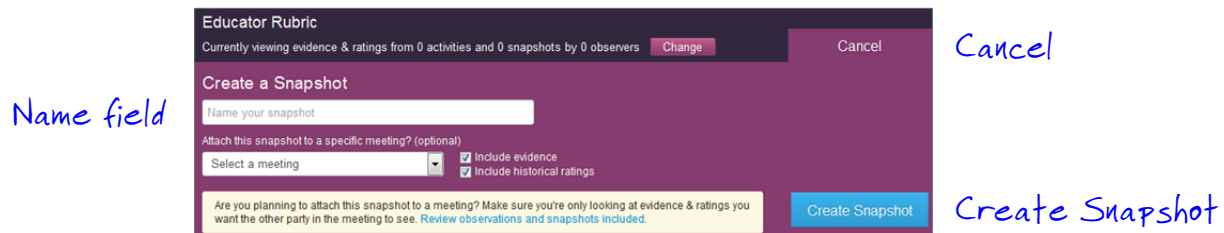

Option 2

Observers can also collect and share ratings by creating a Snapshot. A Snapshot captures ratings and evidence in the form of a screenshot that can be attached to a meeting or emailed directly to a learner.

To create a snapshot, go to the learner's Aggregated Evidence & Ratings (AE&R) tab and click on the "Snapshot" button.



Snapshots are particularly useful to track progress in the middle or end of the school year, or during informal coaching conversations to gauge progress.
